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Ballechin 19 Years (2004/2023)

If you are looking for a whisky that will challenge your taste buds and senses in equal measure, you will find it with the Ballechin 2004/2023 19 Years. This single malt from the Edradour Distillery in the Scottish Highlands is a real powerhouse with 55.00% ABV and offers an intense, smoky experience that will delight Islay fans. But beware: this whisky is not for the faint-hearted!

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

Ballechin reveals its smoky soul from the very first sniff. Black BBQ and an extremely bacon-y character are dominant, immediately evoking associations with smoked meat. Underneath, notes of tar, lime and even a hint of burnt rubber resonate. It's like entering an old factory - industrial, raw and yet fascinating.

PALATE

On the tongue, the Scotch unfolds with a warming, full load of vapour. The flavour is intense and complex: old machine oil, warm rubber tyres and even a hint of linoleum make this whisky a real experience. The smokiness dominates, but it is accompanied by a subtle fruitiness that provides a surprise.

FINISH

The finish is long and voluminous, with a spicy note that lingers for a long time. The subtle oak is noticeable, but is overlaid by the intense smokiness.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

Anyone trying the Ballechin 2004/2023 19 Years should have no fear of intense aromas – this whisky is a smoky rollercoaster ride packed with character and plenty of drinking pleasure. For fans of powerful, bacon-like notes, it's a real highlight that tells stories and leaves you wanting more. Gentle sippers might be better off moving on.

SASCHA

The Ballechin 2004/2023 19 Years impresses with its complex balance of intense smokiness, robust BBQ notes, and subtle fruitiness that beautifully supports its structure. Despite the high cask strength, the single malt feels well integrated, although the dominant, industrial aromas won't be to everyone's taste. A demanding Highland whisky with a distinctive profile.
