Daftmill 15 Years (2006/2022)

This 15-year-old single malt from the Lowlands offers a multifaceted tasting experience that can appeal to both beginners and experienced whisky lovers. With an alcohol content of 55.7%, it unfolds a smooth, almost creamy texture that envelops the senses and creates a harmonious balance between fruity sweetness and subtle complexities. The aromas of peach and citrus fruits are accompanied by a delicate vanilla note and a surprising dryness in the finish, adding an interesting depth to the experience. Despite the high alcohol content, it remains unobtrusive and elegant, making it a fine companion for relaxed moments.

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

Even with the first sniff, a multifaceted play of aromas unfolds, reminiscent of a warm summer day. Honey caresses the senses, while the fresh note of hay and straw conjures a rural idyll. Citrus fruits, robust and lively, blend with the juicy scent of peaches and the exotic sweetness of lychee. A hint of kaffir lime brings an unexpected freshness that underscores the complexity of the aromas. Meanwhile, in the background, the buttery sweetness of a crumb cake resonates, complemented by the delicate presence of oak that gives the bouquet a fine structure. This harmonious connection invites one to dive deeper into the olfactory world and explore the nuances that unfold with each breath.

PALATE

On the palate, a gentle, almost creamy texture unfolds, instantly conveying a sense of calm and relaxation. The mild aromas of bright fruit sweetness, particularly the recurring peach, envelop the senses and create a harmonious balance. As the fruitiness develops further, a peculiar undertone resonates, adding subtle complexity to the experience. This gentle sweetness is accompanied by a light sugar content that gently tickles the taste buds and invites one to delve deeper into the nuanced world of this whisky.

FINISH

In the finish, a surprising dryness remains, gently intertwined with a delicate vanilla note. This combination is accompanied by a lively citrus freshness that refreshes the palate while simultaneously bringing the fruity accompanying notes to the forefront. As the aromas slowly fade, a subtle bitterness lingers, adding an interesting depth to the experience. It is a finish that is not intrusive but rather acts as a calm companion, elegantly rounding off the harmonious composition of this whisky.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

This 15-year-old single malt from the Lowlands leaves a lasting impression, even if it doesn't quite justify the high price. Its gentle elegance and harmonious complexity make it a pleasant companion for relaxed evenings, but the subtle depth may not be enough for some whisky lovers to consider it essential. Perhaps it pairs well with a light cheese, but the question remains: Would I choose it again?

SASCHA

This 15-year-old single malt from the Lowlands is a fine example of artisanal finesse, skillfully balancing elegance and complexity. Despite its gentle demeanor, the subtle depth may not be sufficient for some connoisseurs to consider it essential... A light cheese could be a suitable accompaniment.
