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Secret Speyside (M) 17 Years (2024) The Tasteful 8 - Brühler Whiskyhaus

Mysterious bottlings have their own appeal - and when a whisky from Speyside comes along with 17 years of maturation and a whopping 53.7% ABV, it's worth taking a closer look (and a sip). The Secret Speyside (M) 2024 from 'The Tasteful 8' series from the Brühl whisky house is mysterious, but there are indications that a famous name is involved here ...

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

What's the first thing that hits your nose? A hint of cough syrup! Sounds strange at first, but before you put the glass down in irritation, it continues with an intense load of black tea, dried fruit and a slight 'gamy' note that is surprisingly exciting. This is joined by blackcurrants, tobacco leaf, dark chocolate and dusty oak. Anyone who now thinks that's it is wrong - leather, sultanas, a hint of lemon and a touch of sulphur provide a firework of flavours that is miles away from 'ordinary'.

PALATE

The first sip? Smooth and creamy - but not for long. Suddenly the oak spice comes into play, then it becomes sweet, fruity and slightly floral. And then - bang - another load of dust and a powerful mixture of dark plum and wild berries. Somehow musty, but in a fascinating way. A bit like an old library full of valuable treasures that hasn't been opened for a long time.

FINISH

Here, the whisky remains true to its style: the finish is long, sweet and spicy - a little fruity, a little 'gamy', and surprisingly hardly any oak to be felt. A wild mix.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

Anyone searching for a whisky with character and surprises will find it here - the Secret Speyside (M) 2024 plays with unusual notes like cough syrup and an old library, delivering drinking pleasure far from the mainstream. This is no ordinary Speyside dram, but an exciting adventurer that leaves you wanting more.

SASCHA

A complex, well-structured Speyside whisky that impresses with a balanced interplay of fruity, spicy, and slightly musty notes. Despite the high 53.7% ABV, the Secret Speyside (M) 2024 feels harmonious, though its challenging aroma profile might not appeal to everyone.
