St. Kilian Handfilled Rye & Jack Daniels

If Jack Daniel's and rye were to meet for a cask ale in a Franconian distillery, the result would probably be exactly this whisky: the St. Kilian Handfilled Rye & Jack Daniel's. This hand-filled speciality is so atypically typical that you don't know whether to put it in the rye or bourbon drawer - or rather in both.

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

The whisky is surprisingly clean on the nose - almost like a freshly ironed flannel shirt in the morning dew. Malty and vanilla, with a splash of citrus, clearly St. Kilian's signature. Anyone who has ever had one of their purist drams in a glass will immediately feel at home here. No barrel fuss, no overloaded stuff - just pure clarity with style.

PALATE

The first sip almost feels like a bourbon - but one with rough edges and a little beard. Dry, sweetish, vanilla-like, then suddenly oily to syrupy. And there it is: the rye. Not dominant, but clearly enough to give the dram a little rebellious note. Spicy, savoury, slightly rustic - a nice contrast to the initial sweetness.

FINISH

No big fireworks, but an honest, powerful finish. Medium length, puristic, typical St. Kilian. No smoke, no frills - simply a clean finish that lingers without being intrusive.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

Here, German craftsmanship meets American whiskey DNA - the St. Kilian Handfilled Rye & Jack Daniel's delights with its charming spiciness and a clear, likable personality. It's not mainstream, but a whisky for connoisseurs who appreciate understated yet characterful drams. Drinking pleasure guaranteed - and all with a wink!

SASCHA

The St. Kilian Handfilled Rye & Jack Daniel's demonstrates an impressive balance between sweet bourbon notes and subtle rye spice, framed within a precise, clean structure. Despite its youth, the whisky feels surprisingly mature, with the medium-length, clean finish highlighting the distillery's technical mastery. An exciting example of German-American fusion in the whisky world.
