Wolfburn Langskip

When it comes to honest, unadulterated whiskies, the Wolfburn Langskip is a real insider tip at a very good price. The still young Wolfburn distillery, based in the far north of Scotland near Thurso, brings a statement to the glass with this strong representative that experienced connoisseurs in particular will appreciate: blunt, direct, sweet - and full of character.

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

The first impression: surprisingly smooth for the cask strength. An aroma unfolds that combines maritime freshness with dessert notes. The salty breeze of a coastal whisky meets crème brûlée, salted caramel and apple crumble. Vanilla custard dances in the background with a light malt note and a hint of honey - a real dessert for the nose. No alcoholic sting despite the strength - just multi-layered, balanced flavours.

PALATE

The flavour of the Wolfburn Langskip is like an unadorned summer whisky at cask strength: creamy, dry, honest and very sweet. The first impression is of hay, almonds and a clear cereal note. Then banana, papaya and pineapple come to the fore - tropical fruits in the cask strength version. The texture is thick, almost oily, with a real tang. White pepper adds the necessary spice to the sweet profile.

FINISH

The finish is pleasantly warming, sweet and medium-long - without becoming bitter. Light oak notes provide structure without dominating. The finish is reminiscent of melted sugar with a hint of malt - pleasantly round and accessible.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

A real crowd-pleaser, the Wolfburn Langskip impresses with its creamy sweetness and the fresh breeze from the sea - not a complex cask monster, but pure drinking pleasure with character. For anyone looking for an uncomplicated, cask-strength Highland malt, it's a bullseye that even manages to impress without smoke or sherry.

SASCHA

The Wolfburn Langskip presents itself as a balanced Highland single malt with a clear structure and a harmonious interplay of maritime notes, tropical fruits, and sweet dessert aromas. Despite its powerful 58% ABV, the whisky remains well-balanced and offers a dense, oily mouthfeel that particularly appeals to connoisseurs who appreciate precise cask strength.
